The National Capital Region Cluster coordinator and representatives, namely Kim Karlo Pablo, Jan Ver Dominic Edra and Lian Manalang have started contacting the different NCR Cluster units in their goal of reorganizing and reestablishing coordination among the latter.

The first visitation was with the new unit in Far Eastern University last April 15, 2018, wherein the officers highlighted their plans of gaining recognition from their administration under their campus ministry office; moreover, they presented their achievements for the past academic year which focused mostly on helping nearby underprivileged communities.

The second and third visitation was done on the same date — May 5, 2018 — at the Philippine School of Business Administration and the University of the Philippines Diliman respectively. The officers from PSBA have shared their struggles over the years due to lack of programs aimed at forming both their officers and their members, while UP SCA shared some of the issues they faced. Despite some setbacks, the two units continue to work towards their vision. Both units have laid out their plans for next academic year, hopeful that they bring their aim to fruition.

12th NatCon yields support among Cabanatuan schools

After the 12th SCAP National Leadership Conference held at Lopez, Quezon, Diocese of Gumaca last October 26–29, 2017 we were inspired and challenged. We learned many things. Asking for help is not a sign of weakness but humility, listening to others attentively and acting zealously. We also learned the importance of fervent prayer.

We discovered that when you help a specific community, don't offer your genius solution but instead ask them what common problems they are experiencing and their ideas on how to solve those problems because they are in the situation, not us. They know better than us.

We had a lot of activities for almost 12 years especially religious ones, but we never had a program that answers the problems of the students and communities where we belong. Hence we promised to create sustainable plans focusing on the five areas of SCA: Education and Values Formation, Sustainable Environment, Peace and Social Justice, Science and Technology and the New Media.

And to sustain the enthusiasm, we shared it to other members by celebrating the SCA Solidarity Day (November 13, 2017) and SCA Day (November 26, 2017) inspired by the format of 12th SCAP National Leadership Conference.

Furthermore, to scale up the quality, spirit, and scope of our service, we asked the permission and endorsement of our Cabanatuan Catholic Educational System (CACES) Superintendent and CIC President Rev. Fr. Michael Feliciano I. Veneracion to introduce SCA in CACES Schools. It is a blessing that Fr. Veneracion supports our endeavor.

We initially met with the principals and campus ministry coordinators of the different Catholic School of CACES last April 21, 2018, at Maria Assumpta Seminary.

There are six (6) Catholic Schools who responded positively, and they are willing to join the first ever SCAFE that will be hosted by SCA College of the Immaculate Conception Unit this June 2018.

SCA Lopez shares school supplies, partners eco-saving awareness with Project for the People Philippines-Malaysia

The Student Catholic Action – Lopez, Quezon Council, together with the Project for the People Philippines–Malaysia, served 310 students with school supplies from Kindergarten to Grade IV at Culong Elementary School in Brgy. San Francisco, Lopez, Quezon last March 28, 2018. Culong Elementary School is a noncentral school located at a mountainous area crossing a river.

Victoria Ling Tze Ang, a Malaysian citizen but Filipino by heart, heads the Project for the People. Carlos Ortiz and Kaiye Ong, coordinators from the Philippines and Malaysia, accompanied Ang in the service-mission in collaboration with student volunteers of SCA Lopez. Incoming students received sets of school bag, pencil, pencil case, eraser, ruler, crayon, and notebook, and an eco-bag from Malaysia.

On the other hand, the Diocesan Secretariat has produced 23 graduates from the various colleges and universities in Tagbilaran City. And hail to the Secretary-General of the Diocesan Secretariat, Dale Cyril S. Dejecacion who graduated Magna Cum Laude in Bohol Island State University - Main Campus (BISU-MC). He took the degree program of Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education major in Mathematics.

Last school year was indeed a success, but SCA Tagbilaran did not stop there. Hence, they are more eager to do their mission this coming school year 2018–2019. As a kick-off, the SCA Diocesan Council had its planning and revising of the CM-SCA Constitution and By-Laws and was followed with the planning of the new set of staff last May 11–13, 2018.

SCA CDO reorganizes in training marathon

A fresh core team of chaplains and animators in Cagayan de Oro push to the next level in reorganizing SCA units in the Archdiocese of Cagayan de Oro. In the first quarter of the year, SCA CDO conducted a series of training, formation, and workshops of key animators and students who will facilitate the mobilization and re-opening of SCA programs this coming school year.

The national secretariat facilitated two Students Chaplains and Animators Formation Exchange (SCAfe) programs last February 3–4 and March 3–4, 2018.

Aimed at understanding the basic identity, mission and essential purpose of the movement, SCAfe gathered eight schools, namely: Lourdes College, St. Mary's Academy of Carmen, St. Joseph Academy (El Salvador), Sto. Nino High School of Gitagum, Liceo University, Sacred Heart School of Montessori School, MOGCHS, and Xavier Academy.

The animators who attended SCAfe proceeded to a Preparatory Cell Meeting Marathon Workshop last April 8-9 to equip them with skills in handling PCMs, especially for pioneer groups. A strategic planning followed by a send-off of new student leaders teamed with trained animators was held last May 20 at the Archbishop's House, Cagayan de Oro City.

FEARS

I always tried to make it to the morning Mass.

The brownish book of a Carmelite mystic always getting its way to my breakfast table, a cup of brewed coffee — serene and sacred AM. Then after having my slice of healthy pastry, I would always remember to bring my holy rosary made of freshwater pearls. 19 minutes before six: the Holy Mass was an escape from all the noise of real life and politics.

This was my Catholic lifestyle (the same with my grandsons and daughters and a whole bunch of religious brothers out there) until April 16 rang "the wakeup call" and threatened to break the glass-made illusory peace among indifferent Christian Filipinos — who always thought that they were completely well protected from the fangs of evil and governmental persecution. Thanks to Sister Pat and her cruel detainment, we finally realized that the conflicting and a deficient line between our Catholic and social duties

was always holy and healthy

confusion.

So the whole time I was trying to isolate my spiritual life from the realm of poverty and politics, I was reading the Bible wrong. And now that we already uncovered their tracks, it is a little more than an open secret now that the power of the government lies in the fear of the people. That is, fabricated fear. Fear of the truth, and press freedom, and foreign assistance, and opposition. By the time we know it, this fear that was just fake and made-up was already turning itself into hatred: now we hate the poor, and the oppressed, and the least advantaged. Now we hate Sister Pat.

Who would have known that in a sea of eight and eighty million Filipino Catholics, a 71-year old Australian nun would (almost) be the only one brave enough to break this chain of fear and hatred. While we were feeling fulfilled in attending one-hour Masses, she was spending the last 27 years of her life here, in selfless service of the poor and the peasants. Undoubtedly, it is faith (and an accurate reading of the Gospel) which strengthens her in a time of fascist attack and governmental persecution.

I always tried to make it to the morning Mass. And that's it. Perhaps it was fear that made me contain my being Catholic in just a series of morning Masses and private prayer. Thank you Sister Pat. You have set us free.
